**Notice of Intent to Issue  
Funding Opportunity Announcement No. DE-FOA-0002912 for  
Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, Section 40551:  
Weatherization Assistance Program Enhancement & Innovation**

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Office of State and Community Energy Programs (SCEP), on behalf of the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP), intends to issue a \$25 million Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) entitled “BIL WAP Enhancement & Innovation,” in support of section 40551 of the [Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act \(IIJA\) of 2021](#), also known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL).

**BACKGROUND**

On November 15, 2021, President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. signed the BIL<sup>1</sup>, a once-in-a-generation investment in infrastructure, designed to modernize and upgrade American infrastructure to enhance United States competitiveness, drive the creation of good-paying union jobs, tackle the climate crisis, and ensure stronger access to economic, environmental, and other benefits for disadvantaged communities.<sup>2</sup> The BIL appropriates more than \$62 billion to DOE<sup>3</sup> to invest in American manufacturing and workers; expand access to energy efficiency and clean energy; deliver reliable, clean and affordable power to more Americans; and demonstrate and deploy the technologies of tomorrow through clean energy demonstrations.

To support the goal of building a clean and equitable energy economy, the BIL-funded projects are expected to implement a Community Benefits Plan that (1) supports meaningful community and labor engagement; (2) invests in America’s workforce; (3) advances diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility; and (4) contributes to the President’s goal that 40% of the overall

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benefits from certain federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities (the Justice40 Initiative<sup>4</sup>).

### **FUNDING OBJECTIVES**

Congress, through section 1011(e) of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021,<sup>5</sup> (Pub. L. 116-260), directed DOE to establish a competitive program for WAP Enhancement & Innovation (E&I), with five (5) purposes:

- 1) Expand the number of dwelling units that are occupied by low-income persons that receive weatherization assistance by making such dwelling units weatherization-ready;
- 2) Promote the deployment of renewable energy in dwelling units that are occupied by low-income persons;
- 3) Ensure healthy indoor environments by enhancing or expanding health and safety measures and resources available to dwellings that are occupied by low-income persons;
- 4) Disseminate new methods and best practices among entities providing weatherization assistance; and
- 5) Encourage entities providing weatherization assistance to hire and retain employees who are individuals –
  - a. From the community in which the assistance is provided;
  - b. From communities or groups that are underrepresented in the home energy performance workforce, including religious and ethnic minorities, women, veterans, individuals with disabilities, and individuals who are socioeconomically disadvantaged.

Congress also established the following eight (8) award factors to consider when awarding financial assistance for WAP Enhancement & Innovation:

- 1) The applicant’s record of constructing, renovating, repairing, or making energy efficient single-family, multifamily, or manufactured homes that are occupied by low-income persons, either directly or through affiliates, chapters, or other partners (using the most recent year for which data are available);
- 2) The number of dwelling units occupied by low-income persons that the applicant has built, renovated, repaired, weatherized, or made more energy efficient in the 5 years preceding the date of the application;
- 3) The qualifications, experience, and past performance of the applicant, including experience successfully managing and administering Federal funds;
- 4) The strength of an applicant’s proposal to achieve one or more of the purposes stated above;

- 5) The extent to which such applicant will utilize partnerships and regional coordination to achieve one or more of the purposes stated above;
- 6) Regional and climate zone diversity;
- 7) Urban, suburban, and rural localities; and
- 8) Such other factors as the Secretary determines to be appropriate.

In response to this direction, SCEP anticipates that the FOA may include the following three (3) Topic Areas:

Topic Area 1 – Multifamily Housing

Topic Area 2 – Single Family & Manufactured Housing

Topic Area 3 – Workforce Development

Through the FOA, SCEP tentatively envisions awarding multiple financial assistance awards in the form of grants using funds made available to WAP through section 40551 of the BIL.<sup>6</sup> From the amount appropriated for WAP, DOE intends to make a total of \$25 million in BIL funds available through this opportunity, with a maximum award amount of \$2 million. Eligible entities would include existing WAP Grantees, WAP Subgrantees, and other nonprofit entities. The period of performance for each award would be three (3) years.

This Notice is issued so that interested parties are aware of the SCEP's intention to issue this FOA in the near term. All of the information contained in this Notice is subject to change. Once the FOA has been released, SCEP will provide an avenue for potential applicants to submit questions.

SCEP plans to issue the FOA on or about July 2023 via the Clean Energy Infrastructure eXCHANGE website <https://infrastructure-exchange.energy.gov/>. If eligible entities wish to receive official notifications and information regarding this FOA, they should register in Clean Energy Infrastructure eXCHANGE. When the FOA is released, applications will be accepted **only** through Clean Energy Infrastructure eXCHANGE.

#### **SUBMISSION AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANT APPLICATIONS**

In anticipation of the FOA being released, eligible entities are advised to complete the following steps, which are **required** for application submission:

- Register and create an account in the Clean Energy Infrastructure eXCHANGE at <https://infrastructure-exchange.energy.gov/>. This account will allow the user to apply to any open FOAs that are currently in Clean Energy Infrastructure eXCHANGE.

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To access Clean Energy Infrastructure eXCHANGE , potential applicants will be required to have a [Login.gov](https://login.gov) account. As part of the eXCHANGE registration process, new users are directed to create an account in [Login.gov](https://login.gov). Please note that the email address associated with Login.gov must match the email address associated with the eXCHANGE account. For more information, refer to the Exchange Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) Quick Guide in the [Manuals section](#) of eXCHANGE.

It is recommended that each organization or business unit, whether acting as a team or a single entity, use only one account as the contact point for each submission. - Register with the System for Award Management (SAM) at <https://www.sam.gov>. Designating an Electronic Business Point of Contact (EBiz POC) and obtaining a special password called an MPIN are important steps in SAM registration. Please update your SAM registration annually. Upon registration, SAM will automatically assign a Unique Entity ID (UEI).

**NOTE: Due to the high demand of UEI requests and SAM registrations, entity legal business name and address validations are taking longer than expected to process. Entities should start the UEI and SAM registration process as soon as possible.** If entities have technical difficulties with the UEI validation or SAM registration process they should utilize the HELP feature on SAM.gov. SAM.gov will work entity service tickets in the order in which they are received and asks that entities not create multiple service tickets for the same request or technical issue. - Register in Grants.gov to receive automatic updates when Amendments to a FOA are posted. However, please note that applications will not be accepted through Grants.gov. <http://www.grants.gov/>. All applications must be submitted through Clean Energy Infrastructure eXCHANGE.
